TIMOTHY CHIANG, Pianist in the 2018 Australian National Piano Award 3 – 8 September

Timothy Chiang began his musical studies at the age of five, learning the piano from his mother, and the violin at the age of nine with Brian Blake. From an early age winning numerous prizes, he was awarded a music and academic scholarship to Scotch College (Melbourne) in 2000, where he then continued studying the piano with Mikhail Solovei, and the violin with Leonid Zeyde in 2002.

Timothy has been awarded the LMusA, LRSM and FTCL (piano), and LMusA (violin). He made his orchestral debut at the age of fourteen playing Rachmaninov's Piano Concerto No 1 in Melba Hall, Melbourne Conservatorium, and also performed Liszt's Piano Concerto No 1 in Hamer Hall, Arts Centre Melbourne.

Timothy has been broadcast live on 3MBS 'Fine Music' 103.5 FM. He has won numerous prizes in classical piano competitions including 3rd Prize at the IV International Piano Competition 'ClaMo Región de Murcia' 2018, 2nd Prize in the 2017 Salzburg 'Grand Prize Virtuoso' International Music Competition, 3rd Prize in the 2017 Rising Stars Grand Prix International Music Competition Berlin, and was also a finalist in the 2017 Feurich International Piano Competition, plus he competed in the 2016 Australian National Piano Award. He currently studies with Mikhail Solovei.
